It gives us very great pleasure to once more welcome this Waikanae Music Society favourite back to our stage. He needs no introduction to our audiences. On receiving an Honorary Doctorate from Victoria University, it was observed that "he has contributed substantially to raising the standard of expectations for classical performance, and helped to establish an international standard of musical excellence in New Zealand". For this concert he has, as usual, selected a stunning programme for our delight, opening according to his custom with J S Bach. The fantasy and fugue in G minor, one of the most magnificent of Bach's organ works, will be heard transcribed by Liszt for piano. Liszt was very generous in transcribing and performing the works of other composers in order to promote their music, in this case remaining very faithful to Bach's original.

The programme continues with a selection of Liszt's own works, displaying contrasted facets of this complex composer's skill, ranging from the colourful and extroverted Concert Etudes to the deeply contemplative Bénédiction.

The programme continues with Chinese composer Gao Ping who has very strong connections with New Zealand. His Outside the Window, a set of three short pieces, provides a charming interlude before we return to the music of the romantics with Chopin's famous and very beautiful Sonata in B minor.

NEXT CONCERT

Our April concert will feature firm Waikanae Music Society favourites the Amici Ensemble, featured frequently in our programmes over the years. The makeup of the group is flexible and the long standing and close relationship we have had with its leader Donald Armstrong has led to some very innovative and exciting combinations and performances over the years. Last year was perhaps the most spectacular when Amici was expanded to 17

players to present all six Brandenburg concertos. This year the Amici numbers will be a little more conventional and a string quintet will play for us. FEBRUARY CONCERT

The Dénes Várjon and Izabella Simon concert was a massive success and an incredibly exciting start to our 2024 programme. Concertgoers are still talking about it nearly a month later. "The best Pathétique I have ever heard" a common remark. "Watching that dark clothed figure crouching over the keyboard I thought I was watching Beethoven himself " heard from one. Those feet literally dancing on the pedals during the Bartok work was recalled by another. But most praise was reserved for the Mahler "symphony". It seemed an unlikely idea, transposition of a favourite Mahler symphonic work for piano, but most agreed it really worked.

"The music of the Symphony and its performance here were, both for people like myself familiar with the orchestral version, and for those coming to the work for the first time, a revelation, judging from the reaction at the

concert's end of those who sat all around where I was situated – shouts of approval and exhalations of amazement of all kinds abounded, which must have gratified the two by then well-nigh exhausted players who had given their all over the best part of the previous hour!" - *Peter Mechen for "Middle C" Classical Music Reviews*
